WQOW interview, July 19, 2025

The Lethality Assessment Protocol (LAP) is a collaboration between Family Support Center (FSC) and local law enforcement to connect those most at risk of being killed by their partner with our services. If someone is a high-lethality risk, they are immediately connected to an FSC advocate. So far in 2025, 60 screeners were administered after a domestic incident. Just under half of those screened (47%) were at a high risk of being killed by their partner.

“This program is essential. An overwhelming majority of domestic violence homicide victims (94%) are never connected to services prior to being killed. The LAP program is proven to bridge the gap between people most at risk of being killed with services like FSC so together we can safety plan, address immediate needs, and plan to follow up.

One in six domestic violence-related deaths in the United States take place in Wisconsin. The LAP program aims to not only intervene when domestic violence takes place, but also to educate survivors about possible risks they face and options available. The level of collaboration between FSC advocates, the Chippewa Falls Police Department, and the Chippewa County Sheriff's Office to prevent domestic violence homicides in our community is commendable and inspiring.”

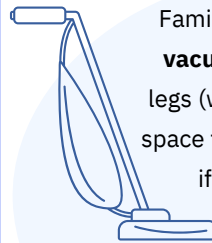

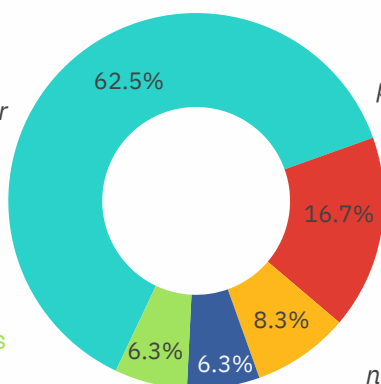
